







Progress 8

- Progress 8 measures the progress made by pupils from primary school to secondary school across eight qualifications.
- A school is considered well below average if their score is below -0.5; a
 score between 0 and -0.5 means the school is below the national average.
- A score between zero and +0.5 means that the school is considered above average.
- A score above +0.5 places a school well above the national average and in the top 20% of all schools nationally.

NHSB P8 - 8 Year View






NHSB A8 V National A8 - 8 Year View



Oversubscription Criteria

Category 1 – Faith based places

Faith based applicants will be ranked in the following order.

Priority Faith-based places

- i. LAC Looked After Children, PLAC Previously Looked-After Children or IAPLAC
- Internationally adopted previously looked after children1 applying for a faith place.
- ii. Siblings applying for a faith place.
- iii. Children of staff applying for a faith place.
- iv. Children in Nishkam Primary School Birmingham applying for a faith place.
- v. Children in Nishkam Primary School Wolverhampton applying for a faith place.
- Remaining Faith-based places will be allocated in the following order.
- i. Child (and/or parent/s or guardian/s) is/are Amritdhari
- (formally initiated) Sikhs.
- ii. Keshdhari Sikh child (has uncut hair).
- iii. Child (and/or parent/s or guardian/s) is/are baptised (or formally initiated) in their respective religion.
