Understanding the world	Early Learning Goal - Talk about the lives of the people around them and their roles in society - Know some similarities and differences between different religious and cultural communities in this country, drawing on their experiences and what has been read in class.

Cultivating Inclusion, Identity and Belonging	Raise awareness of the concept of belonging from children's own perspective, e.g. belonging in relation to family, school, city, faith, culture and world.
